INTRODUCTION

The Congressional Research Service recently released data analysis of Itemized Tax Deductions for Individuals for 2011.

Background.

On 2011 tax returns, 32% of Individual Taxpayers itemized their deductions while 88% chose to use the standard deduction. Of note, taxpayers in different income ranges tend to claim different itemized deductions. In 2011, the higher income taxpayers claimed deductions for charitable gifts, state and local taxes, and real estate property taxes at higher rates than those in the lower income ranges.
