Just like her four-times great grandfather, Angel Crockett is a trailblazer. She chuckles when people ask about her last name. Yes, she's a descendant of Davy Crockett, but that's not what makes her notable. Crockett is a



female CEO running a private company that's hugely successful in the male-dominated national security industry.

By the time Crockett founded Inflow five years ago, her resume was packed with achievements. But while attracting and retaining top talent is

imperative in the defense industry, very few business owners embraced the idea of putting employees first. Crockett set out to change that with Inflow. They allow time off for volunteering and have other initiatives in place—from book clubs to

hackathons to hero awards—to boost employee satisfaction. The company's mission even puts employees first: "To make it matter for every employee, every customer, every mission." When the pandemic hit, Inflow didn't miss a beat moving to a remote work environment as others in their field did because the option was already in place to encourage work-life balance.

By 2019, Inflow was ranked #337 on the Inc. 5000 list and #4 in the under \$10M category for the fastest growing companies in San Antonio by the San Antonio Business Journal. But Crockett isn't solely

focused on Inflow. She and her husband own two other business entities and are active philanthropists as well, which she says has made working with Steven Bankler and his team critically important.

"Having several business entities is complex," she says. "But the Bankler team knows our businesses

intimately, which has been invaluable. During the pandemic, it's been especially helpful to pick up the phone and have them help us make critical decisions in minutes."
